 - 4.1.1. Town of Perrysburg
 - Solar and Wind Moratorium

Type II action

Public Meeting back in January.

Referral is for a solar and wind moratorium suspending the issuance of applications and granting permits, licenses, or approvals for the siting of commercial solar panel power projects, wind turbine projects, and battery projects for a period lasting 12 months.



Exemptions to this moratorium include:

- Properties with rooftop arrays solely for generating site electric:
 - Residential
 - Business
 - Industrial
- Other installations and properties:
 - Municipal
 - Schools

The Referral was complete and there is no significant countywide or inter-community impact. The Staff Recommendation is to **Approve**

4.1.2. Town of East Otto

• Special Use Permit

Marked Type I action, but should be Type II action. No public meeting scheduled at this time.

Type II action:

(18) reuse of a residential or commercial structure, or of a structure containing mixed residential and commercial uses, where the residential or commercial use is a permitted use under the applicable zoning law or ordinance, including permitted by special use permit, and the action does not meet or exceeds any of the thresholds in section 617.4 of this Part;

Referral is for a Special use permit for a property along county road 75. For a part-time automotive repair shop on a residential property. Special use permit required to start the business, and automotive repair is a permitted use with special use permit according to zoning. Reusing garage as business, no new construction planned.

The Referral was complete and there is no significant countywide or inter-community impact. The Staff Recommendation is to **Approve**

Motion was made by Paul Mager to accept the staff recommendations to approve with a second from Danny Newbury. **Motion Carried.**

4.1.3 Town of Allegany

• St. Bonaventure / T-Mobile Special Use Permit / Site Plan Review Unlisted Action, short EAF provided and Negative declaration provided.

Referral is for a special use permit and site plan review to construct telecommunications antennas to extend university Wi-Fi capabilities. Design and structure of the building will no0t be altered.

The addition of these antennas meets height requirements according to zoning code. Cannot exceed 125' height with the antennas reaching an estimated 71' including the



building height. The Allegany planning board found no negative impacts to environment, traffic, historical, or appearance of the building.

The Referral was complete and there is no significant countywide or inter-community impact. The Staff Recommendation is to **Approve**
